2. What is the contract term, and are there options for renewal?	There is no contract with the ALSDE for this RFQ, however, the review allows you to be put on the approved listing for Alabama's K-3 schools for intervention per the <i>Alabama Literacy Act</i> . Having this will enable districts to purchase your product for use in their schools as an intervention program. Automatic renewal occurred for those already on	

	the list this time. That has not been determined for future reviews.
3. For pricing purposes, how many students are expected to use this solution?	This varies based on needs of each school.
4. Is this awarded to multiple vendors or a single?	Multiple vendors
5. When is the anticipated award date?	Undetermined. The review is projected for the end of September.
6. I would like to confirm the requirements for Phase 1, Criteria 1.3 and 1.4. If a program includes documented evidence-based instructional practices but does not have data studies as specified in Criterion 1.3, would it still meet the eligibility requirement for Phase 1, or would it be disqualified? Your clarification on whether the absence of an efficacy study would result in ineligibility would be greatly appreciated!	All elements in Phase 1 must be met for the intervention program to be considered on Alabama's list.

Please let me know if you have any questions or if any additional information would be helpful at this time, and I'll share that with you as soon as possible.

7. In order to pass Phase 1: Eligibility Criteria, are intervention programs required to address all of the listed components (Language Development, Phonological awareness, Phonics, Sight words, Fluency, Vocabulary, and Comprehension)? Could a program still pass if instruction in the program focuses on one or more of these components?

The eligibility criteria are areas specifically outlined in the Alabama Literacy Act, which are required for intervention programs. For a program to QUALIFY for a review, all areas of this section MUST be present. If the Literacy Task Force determines that a "no" is to be checked in any of the boxes for this phase, the review will not be continued and will not be eligible for use in Alabama K-3 schools as a Tier 3 intervention program, often referred to as a Dyslexia Specific Intervention Program, as it is used to support students who may have dyslexia, as well as all struggling readers.

*Disqualification section.

This includes all areas outlined in 1.2.

8. Are submitted intervention programs required or preferred to specifically target students with dyslexia?

For a program to QUALIFY for a review, all areas of this section (PHASE 1) MUST be present. Those are the areas required by the *Alabama Literacy Act* and, therefore, required in the RFQ. Additionally, the program must be considered "age appropriate" as outlined in Phase 3.

17. Where can we find the specific the "community standards for age appropriateness" referenced in the Evaluation Rubric?

AGE APPROPRIATENESS
