RE: RAISE Act Preliminary Guidance and Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 Allocations

Act 2025-257 establishes the *Renewing Alabama's Investment in Student Excellence (RAISE) Act*. The purpose of the RAISE Act is to establish a process to provide additional funding for public K-12 schools to address the educational needs of specific student populations and improve their outcomes. The RAISE Act will be codified in §16-13-360 to §16-13-368 of the *Code of Alabama, 1975*.

Utilizing the official October 2024 student data collection, school systems will receive funding based on weighted allocations for each qualifying student. The qualifying student categories and the percentage multipliers are established in Act 2025-270 as part of the Education Trust Fund (ETF) appropriations. These RAISE Act funds are in addition to the Foundation Program funding.

The attached RAISE Act allocations will be disbursed as part of the monthly Foundation Program disbursement. The Revenue Code/Fund Source is 1140. For FY 2026, the following student categories will receive an additional weighted allocation:

The number of qualifying students in each category will be accumulated from the information submitted in the official October 2024 student data collection. The Students in Poverty count will be students reported as Direct Certification. The Special Education count and the ELL count will be the students reported as Special Education and ELL. The individual Special Education Tier counts will be determined by the reported exceptionality. Tier 1 exceptionalities include specific learning disability, speech/language impairment, and other health impairment. Tier 2 exceptionalities include autism, intellectual disability, developmental disability, and multiple disabilities. Tier 3 exceptionalities include emotional disability, hearing impairment, orthopedic impairment, visual impairment, deaf-blindness, and traumatic brain injury. The Charter School Students count will be the reported Average Daily Membership (ADM) of public charter schools. The Gifted Students count will be calculated as 5% of the reported ADM.

The RAISE Act allows flexibility across student groups in order to best serve students with the greatest needs. In order to collect information for reporting purposes, a flexibility form will be required to be approved by the State Superintendent of Education if your school system chooses to flex 10% or more of the funds between categories. Due to the flexibility option, RAISE Act funds will not be eligible for carryover.

As you plan your FY 2026 budget, please note that At-Risk, Gifted, and ELL allocations historically funded through specific line items in the ETF appropriation have not been funded for the current year. If your school system intends to continue programs previously funded through these ETF line items (fund sources 1410, 1275, and 1252), those expenditures should be budgeted in the RAISE Act program fund source or another appropriate fund source.
