**MEMORANDUM**

**RE:** Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 Education Trust Fund (ETF) Allocations for Summer Reading Camps, Summer Math Camps and Before-/After-School Tutoring

The Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) is committed to providing support for summer camps that are to be offered, at a minimum, to all K-3 students identified with a reading deficiency per the *Alabama Literacy Act (ALA)* and K-5 students identified with a mathematics deficiency per the *Alabama Numeracy Act (ANA)*. Funds appropriated by the State Legislature in support of the Alabama Reading Initiative (ARI) and Office of Mathematics Improvement (OMI), will be utilized for Summer Reading Camps, Summer Math Camps, and before-/after-school tutoring for literacy and mathematics attainment. All funds should be utilized for personnel, professional development, transportation, instructional materials, or partnerships with outside agencies/community support for instructional activity. Funds must be expended by September 30, 2026. For purposes other than these items, you must contact the Alabama Reading Initiative, Office of Mathematics Improvement, or Office of Extended Learning prior to usage.

These allocations can also be combined with funds from the [Supplemental Appropriations \(Act 2025-268\)](#), which support K-12 summer- and after-school programs. Further details for the usage of each set of attached allocations are as follows:

**A. Alabama Summer Achievement Program**

As stated in the ALA, a fully funded Alabama Summer Achievement Program will be available to all K-3 students in public elementary schools that are among the lowest-performing five percent of elementary schools. Each school will receive a per-pupil allocation based on the number of students enrolled in Grades K-3 according to the 2024-2025 ADM. Each school will also receive a base amount, plus teacher salaries based on the number of students scoring below the lowest achievement level on a board-approved assessment in reading administered in spring 2025. Funds will be distributed in January 2026 (1/2 total) and April 2026 (1/2 total). The fund source is 2901.

**B. K-3 Summer Reading Camps (with Math Embedded) and Reading Before-/After-School Tutoring**

Each local education agency (LEA) shall provide summer reading camps (with math embedded) to all K-3 students identified with a reading deficiency. Appropriated funds are divided based on a per-pupil allocation and distributed by the ALSDE to support high-quality summer camps. Each LEA will receive funds based on a per-pupil allocation of the number of students scoring below the lowest achievement level on the board-approved reading assessment during the spring 2025 test administration window. Each LEA shall also provide before-/after-school tutoring with increased attention to third-grade students identified with a reading deficiency on the board-approved reading assessment during the spring 2025 test administration window. Funds will be distributed in January 2026 (1/2 total) and April 2026 (1/2 total). The fund source is 1227.

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C. Alabama Summer Mathematics Achievement Program

As stated in the ANA, a fully funded Alabama Summer Mathematics Achievement Program will be available to all students in Grades 4-5 in public elementary schools that are among the lowest-performing six percent of elementary schools. Each LEA will receive a per-pupil allocation based on the number of students enrolled in Grades 4-5 identified with a math deficiency on a board-approved math assessment during the 2025 test administration window. Each LEA will also receive a base amount, plus teacher salaries based on the number of students identified with a math deficiency. Funds will be distributed in January 2026 (1/2 total) and April 2026 (1/2 total). The fund source is 1769.

D. K-5 Summer Math Camps

Each LEA shall provide summer math camps to all K-5 students identified with a math deficiency. Appropriated funds are divided based on a per-pupil allocation and distributed by the ALSDE to support high-quality summer camps. Each LEA will receive funds based on a per-pupil allocation of the number of students in Grades 4-5, scoring below the lowest achievement level on the board-approved math assessment during the spring 2025 test administration window. Funds will be distributed in January 2026 (1/2 total) and April 2026 (1/2 total). The fund source is 1769.

The total allocations for the Alabama Summer Achievement Program and Alabama Summer Mathematics Achievement Program (if applicable), summer reading and math camps, and before-/after-school tutoring are attached in Appendix A with funding codes.

Requirements for funding:

1. Read and consider the recommendations and resources provided in the [ALSDE Guidance for Summer Learning folder](#).
2. Complete summer reading and math camp locations and budget forms. Detailed guidance will be provided in a forthcoming memo regarding data collection and reporting for K-12 summer programs.
3. Use PowerSchool Student Analytics and Insights to record all fields of the Student Reading Improvement Plan (SRIP) and intervention fields for each student for summer reading camps, summer math camps, and before-/after-school tutoring (reading only). Detailed guidance will be provided in a forthcoming memo regarding data collection and reporting for K-12 summer programs.
4. Funds may only be budgeted and utilized for personnel, professional development, transportation, instructional materials, and/or partnership with outside agencies/community support for instructional activity integration.
