State funding to improve existing gifted services has been approved for the 2020-2021 school year. The funds have been allocated to ensure that gifted services that are currently underfunded have the monetary resources available to help remediate deficiencies that currently exist. In order to facilitate an understanding of the most effective way to allocate these funds, it is incumbent upon the Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) to ensure that local education agencies (LEAs) clearly understand how to achieve the highest Gifted Education Return on Investment (GE-ROI).
