3	Relating to heart defibrillators; to amend Section
4	6-5-332.3, Code of Alabama 1975; to encourage potential users
5	of AEDs to successfully complete appropriate training on the
6	use of AEDs; to require manufacturers of AEDs to provide
7	in-service training on the use and operation of AEDs.
8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
9	Section 1. Section 6-5-332.3, Code of Alabama 1975,
10	is amended to read as follows:
11	"§6-5-332.3.
12	" (a) The Legislature of the State of Alabama finds
13	the following:
14	"(1) Early defibrillation may sustain the life and
15	temporarily stabilize a person in cardiac arrest, thus helping
16	to preserve the Alabama family.
17	"(2) The American Heart Association estimates that
18	more than 350,000 Americans die each year from out of hospital
19	sudden cardiac arrest, and 20,000 deaths may be prevented each
20	year if automated external defibrillators were more widely
21	available.
22	"(b) It is the intent of the Legislature that an
23	automated external defibrillator may be used for the purpose
24	of saving the life of another person in cardiac arrest.

T	$\frac{\pi \cot (a)}{a}$ As used in Section 6-5-332, the term
2	"automated external defibrillator" or "AED" means a medical
3	device heart monitor and defibrillator that meets all of the
4	following specifications:
5	"(1) Has received approval of its pre-market
6	notification filed pursuant to Section 360 (k), Title 21 of
7	the United States Code from the United States Food and Drug
8	Administration Is commercially distributed in accordance with
9	the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act (21 U.S.C. Section
10	301, et seq.).
11	"(2) Is capable of recognizing the presence or
12	absence of ventricular fibrillation or rapid ventricular
13	tachycardia and is capable of determining, without
14	intervention by an operator, whether defibrillation should be
15	performed.
16	"(3) Upon determining that defibrillation should be
17	performed, semiautomatically or automatically charges and
18	requests delivery of delivers an electrical impulse through
19	the chest wall and to an individual's heart.
20	"(d)(b) A person or entity that acquires an AED
21	shall ensure all of the following:
22	"(1) That expected defibrillator users receive
23	appropriate training in an American Heart Association,
24	American Red Cross, or other nationally recognized
25	cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) course and AED, or an

-	equivalent nationally recognized course are encouraged to
2	successfully complete a course in automated external
3	defibrillation and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) that is
4	offered or approved by a nationally recognized organization
5	and includes instruction on psychomotor skills and national
6	evidence-based emergency cardiovascular quidelines that are
7	current.
8	"(2) That the defibrillator is maintained and tested
9	according to the manufacturer's operational guidelines.
10	" (3) That there is involvement of a licensed
11	physician or medical authority in the site's AED program to
12	ensure compliance with training, notification, and
13	maintenance.
14	"(4) That any person who renders emergency care or
15	treatment of a person in cardiac arrest by using an AED
16	activates the emergency medical services system as soon as
17	possible .
18	"(5) That each manufacturer, wholesale supplier, or
19	retailer of an AED notifies purchasers of AED's intended for
20	use in the State of Alabama of the requirements of this
21	section.
22	"(c) Each manufacturer shall provide in-service
23	training materials on the AED use and operation to each person
24	or entity who acquires the AED.

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1	" (e) (d) A person or entity who acquires an automated
2	external defibrillator shall notify the local emergency
3	communications center or dispatch center of the existing
4	location and type of AED distributor of the AED if any change
5	of ownership of the AED occurs.
6	"(f)(e) This section shall not apply to an
7	individual using an AED in an emergency setting if that
8	individual is acting as a good samaritan pursuant to Section
9	6-5-332."
10	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
11	first day of the third month following its passage and
12	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
