2 ENROLLED, An Act,

3 Relating to shooting or discharging a firearm into a
4 school bus or school building; to provide that it would be a
5 crime for a person to shoot or discharge a firearm into an
6 unoccupied or occupied school bus or school building; to
7 provide that the penalty for shooting or discharging a firearm
8 into an unoccupied school bus or school building would be a
9 Class C felony and the penalty for shooting or discharging a
10 firearm into an occupied school bus or school building would
11 be a Class B felony; and in connection therewith would have as
12 its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased
13 expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621
14 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

16 Section 1. (a) No person shall shoot or discharge a
17 firearm into an occupied or unoccupied school bus or school
18 building.

19 (b) A person who shoots or discharges a firearm into
20 an occupied school bus or school building shall be guilty of a
21 Class B felony.

22 (c) A person who shoots or discharges a firearm into
23 an unoccupied school bus or school building shall be guilty of
24 a Class C felony.

1 Section 2. This act shall not be construed to repeal
2 other criminal laws. Whenever conduct prescribed by any
3 provision of this act is also prescribed by any other
4 provision of law, the provision which carries the more serious
5 penalty shall be applied.

6 Section 3. Although this bill would have as its
7 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased
8 expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further
9 requirements and application under Amendment 621 because the
10 bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an
11 existing crime.

12 Section 4. This act shall become effective on the
13 first day of the third month following its passage and
14 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
