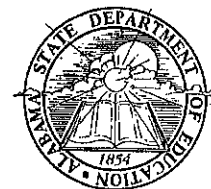

RE: School Records from the Alabama Department
of Youth Services

It has come to my attention that some school systems may be hesitant to approve student credits from schoolwork completed successfully at Alabama Department of Youth Services' facilities. The purpose of this memorandum is to clarify that the Alabama Department of Youth Services is a school system created by the Alabama Legislature (Ala. Code §44-1-70 et seq.). Therefore, educational records received from the Alabama Department of Youth Services are to be treated in the same manner as educational records received from any other public school system, and students are to be given credit for work completed in the same manner.
