What to do with the Help Guide & Where to Find It

Quick Reference to the Help Guide

- Be familiar with federal laws such as IDEA, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 as well as the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (pg. 5)
- KNOW your obligation for Child Find (pg. 12)
- Make certain your IEP Team makes appropriate decisions regarding the student's Least Restrictive Environment (LRE) (pg. 35)
- PRINCIPALS, know your role in monitoring the implementation of Individualized Education Programs (IEPs). (pp. 42-43)
- UNDERSTAND discipline procedures for students with disabilities (pp. 44-54)

Other Suggestions

- Review the IEPs of all students with disabilities who have behavior intervention plans (BIPs) as part of their individualized services.
- Avoid excessive suspensions; be aware of and use cautiously the ten days that are allowed for suspensions without creating a "change of placement".
- Communicate regularly with your special education teachers (case managers) regarding the need to review or revise current IEPs when behavior and/or poor levels of achievement indicate the need for intervention.

Guides for Disciplining Students with Disabilities
