SUBJECT: Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Allocations for Career Coaches

This correspondence is to inform you of the Career and Technical Education (CTE) career coach allocations for FY 2022 in the amount of \$86,188.00. This allocation includes salaries and benefits in the amount of

funds in the amount of \$1,458.00.

Each local education agency (LEA) highlighted in the attachment will serve as the fiscal agent for either one or two coaches. If the fiscal agent is sharing a coach, the partner LEAs are listed below the fiscal agent. If no other LEAs are listed, the coach will serve only the highlighted schools in your LEA. The expectation is to have a career coach in each high school in the state at least one day a week.

\$65,140.00, Other Current Expense (OCE) in the amount of \$20,702.00, and classroom instructional supply

The funds have been listed as an additional CTE director in your unit report; however, this allocation funds the salary and benefits and all classroom instructional support funds for one or multiple career coaches. These allocations are 100 percent state funds and should be budgeted and expended using Revenue and Fund Source 1110 and Object Code 112. Funds must be expended by September 30, 2022. Any unused funds will revert back to the Alabama State Department of Education. The additional FY 2022 CTE funds will be sent monthly with the state funds electronic transfer beginning October 2021 through September 2022.

A copy of a sample Career Coach Job Description and a list of fiscal agents/partner LEAs are attached. If you are the fiscal agent, you are expected to partner with the LEAs sharing the career coach in all aspects of the employment process.
