Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Part B, and

Preschool Flow-Through Allocations

The Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE), Special Education Services (SES) Section, FY 2022 Preliminary Flow-Through Allocations charts for IDEA, Part B, Section 611 (children ages 6-21) and IDEA Preschool, Section 619 (children ages 3-5) were sent out from the ALSDE, Local Education Agency Accounting Section. These funds were made available under the IDEA, Entitlement Grants P.L. 108-446, IDEA, Part B, CFDA 84.027A; 84.173A and are provided to local education agencies (LEAs) based on a federal formula for programs and services to students with disabilities who have an Individualized Education Program (IEP).

In accordance with federal rules, the IDEA federal flow-through funds may be used for staffing, to evaluate a child to determine if he or she has a disability, educational materials, equipment, and other costs to provide special education and related services, as well as supplementary aids and services, to students with disabilities. The IDEA, Part B, Section 611 and Section 619 funds must be used to supplement state, local, and other federal funds used for providing services to children with disabilities and in no case supplant already existing state and local resources. If an LEA meets maintenance of effort, it will satisfy the supplement, not supplant, requirements of IDEA.

The application process and budget software to access these funds is included as part of the consolidated electronic Grant Application Process (eGAP). The budget applications for the allocated IDEA, Part B, and IDEA Preschool funds must be submitted in eGAP by September 15, 2021. In addition, the federal rules indicate that LEAs may not obligate or expend IDEA funds until the grant application budget documents have been received and substantially approved by the ALSDE.
