**SUBJECT:** Shortened School Day for Students With Disabilities

The Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) has developed procedures for local education agencies (LEAs) to verify that each student with a disability receives a full instructional day as provided to his or her nondisabled peers **unless** the Individualized Education Program (IEP) specifies a different length of time based on the individual needs of the student [Alabama Administrative Code, Rule 290-8-9.05(2)(c)]. Obviously, this means each student with a disability must be in his/her classroom at the start of the school day and may not leave the classroom before the end of the school day. This includes students who have a 504 Plan. Furthermore, the start and end times for the school day must be the same for students with disabilities as for their nondisabled peers. Most assuredly, no student with a disability may receive a shortened school day due to transportation schedules or administrative convenience.

After being cited by the United States Office for Civil Rights (OCR), the ALSDE is currently in a resolution agreement to address this issue. We must comply by ensuring that no student with a disability has a shortened school day due to a transportation schedule or administrative convenience.

Enclosed is a form, "Questionnaire Regarding Length of School Day 2021-2022," that must be completed by each school principal and returned to the LEA Special Education Coordinator. As a part of the resolution agreement between the ALSDE and the OCR, the questionnaire must be completed annually until further notice. The questionnaire should not be sent to the ALSDE. The ALSDE staff will review the questionnaire during LEA Compliance Reviews and/or Special Education Technical Assistance visits. Based on the results of the questionnaire, the Special Education Coordinator, 504 Coordinator, Transportation Supervisor, and Superintendent must sign the enclosed "Assurance Statement." The completed "Assurance Statement" must be submitted to the ALSDE, Pupil Transportation Section, Attention Ms. Felicia Toles, by September 30, 2021. The "Assurance Statement" will be filed at the ALSDE for review as necessary by the OCR.
