EDU 314 Behavioral and Classroom Management Google Classroom Technology Project Field Experience

Purpose:

In many school districts, effectively managing a classroom includes facilitating student learning through technology. In the Google Classroom Technology Project, you will create your own mock Google Classroom and provide assignments for students in your field experience classroom.

Directions:

- 1. Complete Educator Level 1 Fundamentals Training (Link: https://teachercenter.withgoogle.com/fundamentals/preview)
- 2. Create your own Google Classroom teacher page.
- 3. Customize the appearance of your class.
- 4. Seek permission from your teacher to add a small group of your students to your class (minimum of 4 students).
- 5. Design a "getting to know you" task for your students and post it to your students' pages. You may use a resource for the document rather than developing it on your own; however, be certain to cite your source.
- 6. Create a Google Doc with an assignment that is appropriate for your grade level and content area. Involve a small group of students in utilizing the document. Each student needs to contribute to the Google Doc at least twice.
- 7. Create a Google Calendar and post three mock due dates.
- 8. Post an assignment for your small group to complete. Then grade the assignment in the Google app. Make comments on the document as you grade the assignment.
- 9. Type a one-two page reflection explaining what you learned about using a course management system with students. What challenges did you face? What are the benefits of using technology to share documents, assignments, grading, etc.?
