How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

Our school system has been communicating with administrators as well as other systems and janitorial vendors to determine best practices for maintaining a safe environment for our students and employees. We are currently conducting a needs assessment and a survey of parents. These assessments should allow us to determine and prioritize our needs.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

Our teachers, administrators, and instructional coaches will look at data from last year to determine the students that will likely be at risk. Fall 2020 screening data will be used to identify others that have fallen behind due to school closure. The LEA plans to implement more technology and begin using software such as, but not limited to Schoology for the Learning Management System (LMS) to better assist students and parents. Implementing this LMS will better allow us to track our progress.

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What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

The LEA is developing parameters for each school within the district. The parameters should be complete by mid-July. Each school will create a site-based plan within the parameters and submit for approval by the end of July. Training for remote learning as well as our LMS are currently planned for July and August and will continue throughout the school year. [Dates are subject to change as COVID-19 guidelines change.] All funds will be expended by September 30, 2022.

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

The ESSER funds will be used to promote remote learning by purchasing devices, hot spots, packets, programs, as well as other items needed for students to learn remotely. The funds will also be used to provide some training for teachers as well as substitutes during the training. These funds may also be used to hire personnel to teach virtually.

3. Equitable Services Assurances

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies the following:

- The LEA receiving ESSER funds will provide equitable services to students and teachers in non-public schools as required under Section 18005 of Division B of the CARES Act.

(5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;

(6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;

(7) that in the case of any project involving construction -

(A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;

(8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and

(9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
(c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

(a) The purpose of this section is to assist the Department in implementing the Department's mission to ensure equal access to education and to promote educational excellence throughout the Nation, by -

(c) The Secretary may establish criteria and provide technical assistance for meeting the requirements of this section.(d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter in any way the rights or responsibilities established under the laws cited in section 400(d) of this Act.
