PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

How will the LFA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-197

Decatur City Schools developed a task force consisting of administrators and supervisors to determine the most important educational needs resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. This task force met numerous times and outlined several areas that need immediate attention.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

Decatur City Schools will administer a pre-assessment to students during the months of July and August 2020 to determine reading and math proficiency. We will provide targeted small group instruction to address academic deficits and to accelerate learning opportunities for students identified via the pre-assessment. DCS will follow the system-wide pacing guides which are in alignment with the state's academic content standards and administer common assessments to determine academic growth or areas in need of improvement. For any areas in need of improvement, instructional plans will be developed. Additionally, DCS will conduct data meetings (in person and/or virtually) to continue to monitor student achievement. In the summer of 2021 DCS will hold a 6 week summer school learning program. DCS will provide transportation for the summer learning program.

What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

Decatur City Schools will be providing a Summer Learning academy in July 2020 in order to address academic gaps in reading and math. DCS will provide transportation for the Summer Learning academy. DCS has assembled a task force comprised of teachers from across the district. In June and July 2020 this task force will develop the virtual curriculum (which aligns with the pacing guides) that will be used for our virtual option and/or to be used in the event of a school closure due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The members of this task force will be paid a minimal stipend. DCS plans on purchasing student devices (hardware and connectivity) by September 2020. Additionally DCS plans to purchase custodial supplies to sanitize and clean ell of our facilities. The purchases will be made throughout the summer and all of the 2020-2021 school year. All services will conclude by September 30, 2022.

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

DCS has assembled a task force comprised of teachers from across the district. In June and July 2020 this task force will develop the virtual curriculum (which aligns with the pacing guides) that will be used for our virtual option and/or to be used in the event of a school closure due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The members of this task force will be paid a minimal stipend. DCS plans to purchase student devices by September 2020 to ensure each student has a device to facilitate on line learning. Additionally, DCS will provide connectivity devices to any student who needs internet access.

3. Equitable Services Assurances

Equitable service funds will be used by the private schools to plan and coordinate during long-term closures, including how to provide meals to eligible students, technology for online learning to elif students, guidance for carrying out requirements under IDEA, and ensure other oducational services can continue to be provided consistent with all Federal, state, and local requirements. Additionally, supplies to sanitize and clean fecilities will be purchased. A timely and meaningful consultation will occur with private schools through a virtual meeting with private school leaders and the Decetur City Schools CSFO and Federal Programs Supervisor. All services and sesistance will be implemented fitroughout the 2020-2021 school year. All funds will be epent by September 30, 2022, NOTE: The original ESSER I application equitable services amounts were calculated based on total students. This amendment has been emended to recalculate equilable services using the proportionality method. This changed the emounts to each of our private schools, it increased St. Ann's by \$3,652.51. However, it significantly decreased the emount for Decatur Heritage using 6,889.90 more than they should have been ellocated. We have met with both schools and we have submitted emended equitable services implementation forms.

OTHER ASSURANCES AND CERTIFICATIONS

4. Other Assurances and Certifications

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies the following:

- The LEA that receives ESSER funds will, to the greatest extent practicable, continue to compensate its employees and contractors during the period of any disruptions or closures related to COVID-19 in compliance with Section 18006 of Division B of the CARES Act. In addition, LEAs that accept funds will continue to pay employees and contractors to the greatest extent practicable based on the unique financial circumstances of the LEA. - (6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;
 - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
 - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and
 - (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and
- (9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
- (c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

- (a) The purpose of this section is to assist the Department in implementing the Department's mission to ensure equal access to education and to promote educational excellence throughout the Nation, by -
- (1) ensuring equal opportunities to participate for all eligible students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries in any project or activity carried out under an applicable program; and

- (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter in any way the rights or responsibilities established under the laws cited in section 400(d) of this Act.

What steps does the LEA propose to take to permit students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries to overcome barriers (including barriers based on gender, race, color, national origin, disability, and age) that impede equal access to, or participation in, the program?

Decatur City Schools is planning on providing each student in our district with a device to facilitate on-line learning. DCS will also provide a connectivity device to those students who need Internet access. DCS will provide instructional materials/supplies for all students, including English Learners, Migrant, Homeless, Foster Care, those with disabilities, low income, et. Additionally DCS will provide interventionists who will provide small group instruction in an effort to target skill regression due to school closure.
