The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

The district leadership team has reviewed the district's Needs Assessment, recent parent, student, and teacher surveys, Title 1 surveys, district technology plan, and local expenditures due to Covid-19 and prioritized expenditures with the ESSER Funds. We will also complete a needs assessment in each school. We have surveyed parents about effectiveness of our virtual and at-home learning options from last year. Based on the data, the team will determine the accessibility of technology

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

Students will be given appropriate screeners, and we will use data from mid-year screeners to determine students that were behind or students that were at-risk of falling behind. We will look at the Fall 2020 screening data and compare it to the mid-year 2019 data to establish gaps. We will also look at retention during the 2019-2020 school year. We will look at standards that were covered through educational packets instead of face to face instruction. These standards will be used for remediation purposes in the fall to help students.

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What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

The first implementation is already underway. July 2020 we will implement proper sanitizing procedures before students return, to include training and securing proper chemicals and distributors. Automatic hand dryers and bottle filling stations will be acquired in order to promote safer, touch-free procedures. Extra healthcare supplies will be purchased to help in keeping both are faculty and students safe. In addition, we will close the gap in our One to One Initiative by purchasing technology hardware. From August to December of 2020, we will implement remediation/intervention strategies, secure campuses, coordinate with local officials and procure other technologies needed to support a digital platform. Extra custodial staff will be hired to help keep our students safe and healthy. From January 2021 and beyond, we will support the overall learning process and deal with obstactes as they arise. The continues education of our students along with safe sanitation procedures as related to Covid-19 will be top priorities for Geneva City Schools. All funds will be expended by September 20, 2021,

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

These funds will be used to purchase more technology for students to use at home if necessary. We will initiate a plan to provide wifi services for low-income students or students in rural areas that have limited access. Professional development for our teachers will be provided to ensure that staff members are well trained and supported for the implementation of digital learning. (Professional development will be paid by Title II funds or local funds)

(5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;

(6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;

(7) that in the case of any project involving construction -

(A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and

(B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the

Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;

(8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and

(9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
(c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers.
