The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

#### 2. Allowable Service(s) Assurance

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies that:

The LEA will use ESSER funds for activities allowable under section 18003(d) of Division B of the CARE5 Act. The United States Department of Education does not consider the following to be an allowable use of ESSER funds, under any part of 18003: 1) subsidizing or offsetting executive salaries and benefits of individuals who are not employees of the SEA or LEAs or 2) expenditures related to state or local teacher or faculty unions or associations.

How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

Surveys will be used to determine needs based on safety and academic concerns. Pathways for instruction as well as supports to be used to address safety and learning considerations to include technology and SEL issues will be developed. Data at each school will be reviewed at the LEA and District Level to determine current and future planning.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

District will analyze benchmark data (Fall) and survey teachers through collaborative methods. AIMS Web, iready and Achieve 3000 are the assessments to be used. Summer Programs conducted face to face and virtually.

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What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

Close of 19-20 school year until 9/30/22. Equipment and supplies will be purchased for the upcorning year during the summer. PPE for staff and students including Plexi-glass shielding for classrooms as well as cafeterias will be readily available for the start of schools. Teachers will be oriented and given resources to build digital content for classroom use. Summer school will be conducted for students in a virtual and face to face format.

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

By developing virtual courses, purchasing digital content and providing stipends for educators to build courses. Devices will be available for all students. Classroom teachers will be paid stipends to construct virtual courses outside of their regular work day. These courses will be available for teachers throughout the district.

#### 3. Equitable Services Assurances

Equitable service funds were offered and declined by two of the three private schools. Sacred Heart will participate and will utilize funds for the purchase of sanitizing and cleaning supplies, educational technology, and instructional materials. Orgoing communication has started and will continue with LEA Federal Programs Coordinator and Private School Contact. Initial consultation is complete. Proposed timeline for services and assistance is for the FY 21 school year.

#### 4. Other Assurances and Certifications

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies the following:

- The LEA that receives ESSER funds will, to the greatest extent practicable, continue to compensate its employees and contractors during the period of any disruptions or closures related to COVID-19 in compliance with Section 18006 of Division B of the CARES Act. In addition, LEAs that accept funds will continue to pay employees and contractors to the greatest extent practicable based on the unique financial circumstances of the LEA. (4) that the local educational agency will make reports to the State agency or board and to the Secretary as may reasonably be necessary to enable the State agency or board and the Secretary to perform their duties and that the local educational agency will maintain such records, including the records required under section 443, and provide access to those records, as the State agency or board or the Secretary deem necessary to perform their duties;

(5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;

(6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;

(7) that in the case of any project involving construction -

(A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;

(8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and

(9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
(c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

## 6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

(a) The purpose of this section is to assist the Department in implementing the Department's mission to ensure equal access to education and to promote educational excellence throughout the Nation, by -
