How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-197

As a result of COVID-19, the current needs assessment was adjusted to reflect input from district and school administrators, certified and classified staff, parents and families, community leaders, including business stakeholders, and other local partners. Input was received from face to face and virtual meetings, social media forums, and surveys conducted by the superintendent.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

Mid-year benchmerk reading and malk date was analyzed by the district and school teams to determine the existing gaps among all students as well as by individual student groups. In April and May, teachers used data to plan for instruction based an critical standards. The district and schools have identified various instructional platforms needed to supplement core instruction as well and assist with tracking student gains and differentiating instruction upon administration of the universal scheener once schools are re-opened. Varied instructional resources that address appecialized instructional needs for identified student groups will be purchased to help scaffold various liers of instruction. Additionally, a virtual summer program was offered to K-3 eludents identified as most in need of reading instruction toward grade lavel mestory. Staff professional development will be identified and provided to help implement instructional resources in both fraditional and virtual platforms. The identified needs include professional development, instructional software, technology, haelth and safety equipment, and parent communication.

What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

Scottsboro City Schools began to offer services and assistance to students and staff once all information and feedback was obtained and needs were prioritized. In April and May 2020, meets were provided to at-risk students by facultles and staff through our transportation department. Cleaning and sanitizing throughout the district has been on going while following protocol with 12 month employees throughout the summer. Additional cleaning supplies have been cridered to maximize safety efforts of all students, faculty and staff as the re-opening of schools' plans are developed. Instruction has been provided to K-3 at-risk students remotely during the summer in an attemt to help prevent further summer slide. Haelth and safety supplies were ordered to meet the needs of students and staff on campus as directed by the timeline directives by the ALSDE. All funds will be expended by 9/30/2022.

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

ESSER funds will be used to purchase instructional software, computer hardware (including wi-fi access), and to provide virtual professional development (purchased services). All of these services will be needed to support remote learning for all students.

 - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
 - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and

Ongoing staff development is being provided to all staff to support the academic and behavioral needs of all students. Our human resources/communications director will provide assistance for all staff. Our social worker will provide additional support to all students and their families in need.
