### PROGRAMMIATIC PISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES.

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

#### 2. Allowable Service(s) Assurance

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies that:

The LEA will use ESSER funds for activities allowable under section 18003(d) of Division B of the CARES Act. The United States Department of Education does not consider the following to be an allowable use of ESSER funds, under any part of 18003: 1) subsidizing or offsetting executive salaries and benefits of individuals who are not employees of the SEA or LEAs or 2) expenditures related to state or local teacher or faculty unions or associations.

#### How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

By a thorough needs analysis done by SCS leadership and all relevant (internal and external) stakeholders. Internal stakeholders included meetings with leadership team, administrators, department heads and teachers. External stakeholders included parent survey and discussions with PTO leadership. The results of this collaboration were clear, completing the 1;1 technology initiative to ensure that every student in the district has a device (Chromebook, IPad, etc) is the most effective task to ensure remote learning can occur. Procuring the devices also requires the purchase of storage equipment, charging capability, and related services to deploy the devices. Additionally, cleaning supplies that can be used to continue to keep the learning environment as safe as possible.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

SCS intends to use established formative assessments, and students will go through problem solving test (PST) process to determine remediation needs. These devices will be used in conjunction with existing instructional technology to provide appropriate levels of remediation where needed.

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# What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

For purchases with ESSER funding, intent is to order all items immediately. Chromebooks will be prepared, distributed and available for use at the start of the 2020-21 school year and will be on-going from that point forward. If there are supply chain delays, we intend to deploy as soon as physically possible once received. All funds will be used no later than September 30, 2022.

# How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

By completing the 1:1 initiative, every student in Satsuma City Schools will have access to a device that may be used from a remote location to access any relevant content related to instruction. This will be done so within the framework of our existing Technology Plan. Additional wireless access points have been implemented for small percentage of students with no Internet access from home. Information about how to receive either discounted or free Internet connectivity services has been shared through multiple communication channels with parents.

#### 3. Equitable Services Assurances

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies the following:

- (5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;
- (6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;
  - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
    - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities:
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and
- (9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
- (c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

### 6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances
