### PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. ### How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

District administrators will have meetings to evaluate needs encountered due to COVID-19 including needs assessments for cleaning supplies and equipment, personal PPE, instructional needs, student devices, software and connectivity. Follow up meetings will be held to evaluate and prioritize needs identified during the process. CARES Act funding will be used to ensure all students will be receive quality instruction in the classroom and/or virtually using several instructional platforms and assessment tools purchased by the district.

# How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

Boaz City Schools plans to universally screen all students in the areas of reading and math to identify or predict possible learning gaps due to COVID-19 or other education disruptions. Students will be provided with learning pathways that address learning gaps through core and blended instruction through shared planning opportunities at each school. District/school leadership teams will meet quarterly to review data and discuss academic trends and patterns.

# What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

Services will provided as soon as applicable. Orders for many items such sanitizer, cleaning supplies and equipment, and PPE have already been placed in preparation for the return of students in August. Many other items are also ready to be put into action as soon as the CARES - ESSER application is approved including remote learning instruction and professional development and additional cleaning supplies and equipment. All services will conclude by September 30, 2022.

### How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

Funds will be used to purchase additional hardware (Chromebooks, iPads, etc.) and software as needed, as well as provide funding for virtual school/remote learning instruction and remote learning professional development.

### 3. Equitable Services Assurances

  - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
    - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overal! State plans for the construction of school facilities, and (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and
- (9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
  (c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

#### 6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

Through implementation of its current policies, the Boaz City school system will continue to provide services to all students, teachers, and other program beneficiarles without barriers, regardless of the manner in which those services are provided. Should the need arise for school closure, those resources needed by students and/or teachers to provide continuation of the educational program through on-line instruction, will be provided by the school system to those individuals who do not have access to those resources and materials on their own.
