PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

2. Allowable Service(s) Assurance

The LEA will use ESSER funds for activities allowable under section 18003(d) of Division B of the CARES Act. How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

Brewton City Schools will determine the most important educational needs of our students by conducting a needs assessment including information collected through administrator, teacher, parent, and student surveys. The most current academic student data and current research will be reviewed as part of our needs assessment. We will follow required guidelines and regulations from governmental and health agencies.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

Students will be assessed using DIBELS, Star Reading and Math, Reading Inventory, and Scantron to determine students' needs and learning gaps that may have resulted from the disruption in educational services. Teachers will use the results from these assessments, as well as formative assessments, to determine skills and standards that need to be taught or retaught in whole groups, small groups, or individually to meet the needs of all students.

What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

Services and assistance for students and staff have been or will be provided beginning March 2020 and may continue through September 2022. All funds will be expended by September 30, 2022.

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

Funds will be used to provide professional development for teachers to effectively provide remote learning through Schoology and Schools PLP for students who choose the virtual/remote option and for all students in the event that schools must close due to COVID. Funds will be used to pay salaries and benefits for personnel to facilitate remote learning. Additional software programs will be purchased to address students' educational needs. Devices and connectivity assistance will provided as needed to ensure all students have access.

3. Equitable Services Assurances

- (5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;
- (6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;
 - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
 - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and
 - (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and
- (9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
 (c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

- (a) The purpose of this section is to assist the Department in implementing the Department's mission to ensure equal access to education and to promote educational excellence throughout the Nation, by -
