PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

Haleyville City Schools will follow guidance from ALSDE as well as the CDC as we open schools and determine needs for the 2020-2021 school year. Our leadership team has met and began to gather needs for cleaning/disinfecting buildings, instructional support and remediation, health supplies, CNP supplies, student support services and teacher support services. We also see a great need to support the nursing staff by providing additional medical aides.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

Haleyville City Schools will host PD sessions this summer to determine the standards not mastered during the 2019-2020 school year and begin to develop assessments to determine student needs and gaps. We will use iReady as well as IXL to test as well and to assist with the development of learning paths for our students. A great deal of time will be spend in pre-assessment, compacting, enrichment and remediation of students.

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What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

We will provide services throughout the 2020-2021 school year to all students. We will assess student's academic, social and emotional needs the first few weeks of schools and develop plans of action for those needing immediate intervention and for those who need additional support throughout the year. We will also be working with parents throughout the year to provide support.

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

Funding will be used to train teachers on distance learning, used to purchase Zoom and the technology needed to ensure quality teaching lessons through online formats, used to provide hot spots in the community and used to purchase chromebooks and other devices necessary to effectively provide remote learning.

- (5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;
- (6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;
 - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
 - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and
 - (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and
- (9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
- (c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

What steps does the LEA propose to take to permit students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries to overcome barriers (including barriers based on gender, race, color, national origin, disability, and age) that impede equal access to, or participation in, the program?

We work with all students to find ways to remove barriers to learning. We are providing a great deal of training for our teachers to ensure they are meeting the needs of their students. We are working to make fiber internet accessible to all neighborhoods and devices available for students to use with distance learning. Our first goal will be to determine needs based on assessments that help us ensure mastery of content missed or that needs remediation. The LEA will work as quickly as possible to address and correct any issues or barriers that may arise in our community in order to comply with the requirement of participation in the CARES Act program.
