How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

Thomasville City Schools conducted surveys with parents, teachers, administrators and a need assessments to determine the needs of the students and support teachers in providing instructions. Interviews from parents indicated that internet service was a problem and their child would have benefitted from having a teacher explain their assignments through videos. Teachers indicated a need for more training on teaching and providing services for students during COVID-19.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

Thomasville City Schools will identify learning gaps resulting form the disruption in eductional services (COVID-19) by giving a diagnostic assessment to all students upon returning to school to measure if any skills were lost and to determine the instructional level needed. STAR Early Literacy will be given to grades k-8 and Scantron Performance Series will be given to students in grades 9-12. After-school tutoring will also be provided for students who lost skills during school closure and those "AT RISK".

The purposed timeline for providing service to students and staff is June 2020 through May 2022.

Thomasville City Schools will use ESSA funds to provide professional development to teachers and administration on providing services through remote learning such as using youtube videos, online learning, google classroom, zoom, schoology, and materials covered through online software.

- (5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;
- (6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;
 - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
 - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and
 - (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and
- (9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
- (c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

- (a) The purpose of this section is to assist the Department in implementing the Department's mission to ensure equal access to education and to promote educational excellence throughout the Nation, by -

- (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter in any way the rights or responsibilities established under the laws cited in section 400(d) of this Act.
