1. Project Narrative - Each LEA must demonstrate a plan to advance innovative best practices in Work-Based Learning opportunities to address local workforce development needs. (80 Points)

Project Narrative - A. Describe how the program expansion will create equity and access by illustrating a plan to offer a program to ensure equitable representation of diverse populations, including but not limited to race, gender, socio-economic backgrounds, special populations, or students with disabilities. (20 points)

Project Narrative - B. Describe how the success of the program will be measured. (20 Points Total)

- a. Clear picture of how data will be collected. (10 points)
- b. Clear picture of how data will be used to demonstrate the degree to which outcomes are met and how student achievement is impacted. (10 points)

Project Narrative - C. Address the following Work-Based Learning Best Practices: (20 Points)

- a. Be equitable and inclusive.
- b. Be anchored in careers, standards based, grounded in experiential and hands on learning.
- c. Be integrated into the broader K-12 or P-20 career development system.
- d. Be intentional in regard to meaningful employer engagement.
- e. Be dedicated to instructional time for career development.
- f. Be communicated effectively to students and their families.
- g. Be focused on student growth.

Project Narrative - D. Provide a sustainability plan beyond the grant funds. (20 Points Total)

- a. Illustrates a plan to sustain grant activities after the grant period. (10 points)
- b. Identify sources of funds that can leverage the state and/or local funds and help to ensure the project is sustainable beyond the grant period. (10 points)
- 2. Preliminary Budget/Certification Page—Each LEA must complete the preliminary budget page. (20 Points Total)

 The grant awards shall not exceed \$30,000.00 per grant. The grants are Cooperative Education; Program/Industry Specific; and Work-Based Learning Expansion (to include simulated workplace, CTE lab, or transition services for students with disabilities).

The estimated number of awards will be 97. Each Alabama Workforce Development Region can receive up to thirteen (13) Cooperative Education Grants; up to six (6) Program/Industry Specific Grants; and up to six (6) Work-Based Learning Expansion Grants in the amount of \$30,000.00 per grant.
