How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

ACCEL Academy will collect student academic data using the NWEA Map Assessment to measure learning gains and declines in ELA and Math. Additionally, students will take socio-emotional assessments to determine students needs aligned to non-cognitive factors. Lastly, the academy will interview families to determine any family basic needs deficiencies.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

ACCEL Academy will asses student learning gaps using the NWEA Map Assessment. Students will then be assigned to intervention classes during school and provided after-school and summer intervention/enrichment experiences in-person and virtually to close learning gaps.

ESSERfunds will be utilized to support ongoing computer maintenance and IT services related to the use of remote learning devices for students and staff.

 - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and
- (9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
