## **PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES**

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

#### 2. Allowable Service(s) Assurance

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies that:

The LEA will use ESSER funds for activities allowable under section 18003(d) of Division B of the CARES Act. The United States Department of Education **does not** consider the following to be an allowable use of ESSER funds, under any part of 18003: 1) subsidizing or offsetting executive salaries and benefits of individuals who are not employees of the SEA or LEAs or 2) expenditures related to state or local teacher or faculty unions or associations.

How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

The Marshall County School district developed a leacher survey to gain academic insights and gather feedback regarding distance teaming. Only 66% of teachers serving students in grades 6 ihroug 12 responded that they have the resources needed to work with their students. With teachers serving students in kindengarten through grade 5, the percentage dropped to 49%. In addition, teachers responded that teaching students removely had been more difficult than expected with 31% and 47% responding respectively.

With the survey results, the district leadership team determined that additional technology would best meet the needs of teachers and students in Marshall County Schools. Additionally, we felt PPE and sanitation supplies are important.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

The Impact of lost instructional time is anticipated and the district will be prepared to adjust curricula and instructional practices accordingly. Students' learning gaps will be assessed and Individual learning paths established.

Via the purchased technology, tiered and intervention Instruction will be provided to respond to the academic needs of at-risk students. This will be especially important during the times of Intermittent closures due to Covid-19 outbreaks.

#### What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

The audio-visual professional development for teachers will be provided prior to the 2020-21 school year and I e platform will be available to students at the beginning of the school year. If the need for Intermittent or long-term closure is required, online learning or all students will now be accessible. All funds will be expended by September 30, 2022.

## How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

The district will purchase educational technology, including hardware, software, and connectivity for students to aid regular and substantive educational interaction between students and teachers. The technology will assist teachers in creating, managing, and delivering content to students.

This technology will allow the district to implement summer learning and supplemental after school programming to address the needs of all students. Tiered instruction, along with small group intervention will address the needs of at-risk learners and students identified with disabilities. In addition, this technology will allow homebound students live access to the classroom, as well as pre-recorded content.

4. Other Assurances and Certifications

(6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;

(7) that in the case of any project involving construction -

(A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;

(8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and

(9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
(c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

What steps does the LEA propose to take to permit students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries to overcome barriers (including barriers based on gender, race, color, national origin, disability, and age) that impede equal access to, or participation in, the program?

All students k-12 will have equal access to the audio-visual program.

In March, the district conducted home surveys to determine the need for internet access and devices. From the survey results, 427 hotspots and 1,685 Chromebooks were provided to students who did not have internet access and/or a device. Additional Chromebooks will be purchased for school use. Should barriers arise, the district will bring a resolution as quickly as possible.
