PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

2. Allowable Service(s) Assurance

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies that:

The LEA will use ESSER funds for activities allowable under section 18003(d) of Division B of the CARES Act. How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

Russell County convened a committee of representatives from finance, transportation, maintenance, instruction, school counseling, special education services, federal programs, and school leadership. The committee discussed effects of COVID -19 disruption to education, identified needs and impact, assessing the learning gap, remote learning, social emotional support, and sanitation of the facilities. Survey results from stakeholders were also used to gather information. From these meetings, a needs assessment was created. *During the revision process, it was determined that additional services and resources would be necessary. Additional classroom furniture was needed for social distance spacing. COVID presented the need for a permanent sub at each school. The additional cleaning created the need for custodian overtime.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

The eight essential standards will be assessed using iReady for early literacy and math foundational skills for K-8 and Class Works for 6-12. Information gained will be used to provide tiered and individualized instruction. Instructional strategies that will be used are increased instructional time, evident based intervention curriculum, progress monitoring, deepen professional development for teachers, and teaching students through their preferred learning style. *Preliminary diagnostics in grades 10-12 need additional instructional support. It was determined that ACT prep materials would be used to provide the during the instructional support.

What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

June 2020-Develop and implement procedures to improve preparedness and response; Purchase supplies to sanitized and clean facilities (on-going). Provide training and professional development for sanitation and minimizing the spread of infection disease (on-going)
July 2020-Provide professional development for instruction teachers and para professionals-quarterly; Purchase of equipment and materials for remote learning (purchase and repair as noticed after initial purchase); Hire intervention support; purchase instructional materials needed to provide intervention
August 2020 Provide training for students and parent on remote learning and minimizing the spread of infectious disease; School Counselors make follow up contact with student who were experiencing social maladjustments during the separation (monthly)
December 2020- July 2021 Assess the impact of the purchases and trainings
May 2021 Assess the impact of the purchases and learning
This cycle will repeat as needed through September 30, 2022

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

These funds will ensure that all students have access to an electronic device. It will also be used to assist with providing Internet accessibility to students. Professional development will be provided for teachers, parents, and students to maximize learning. * Google Voice will be used for additional communication during virtual tutoring. Books will be converted to digital resources so that students may have access during remote learning. The document cameras (Hoover Cams) were used as cameras and projection. With the addition of devices, the need for pairs and maintenance increased.

 - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
 - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and
 - (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
 - (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and

What steps does the LEA propose to take to permit students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries to overcome barriers (including barriers based on gender, race, color, national origin, disability, and age) that impede equal access to, or participation in, the program?

Russell County will make materials and services accessible to all beneficiaries to the greatest extent possible. Needs assessment results will allow RCSD to create a focused plan of action. If accessibility to technology is a barrier, school buses with wifi capabilities will be deployed in those areas and in some cases hot spots will be given. When necessary, translation services will be provided for English Language Learners. *In order to better assist the special needs population, additional technological devices were needed such as computers, printers, and ink.






