PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

2. Allowable Service(s) Assurance

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies that:

The LEA will use ESSER funds for activities allowable under section 18003(d) of Division B of the CARES Act. The United States Department of Education does not consider the following to be an allowable use of ESSER funds, under any part of 18003: 1) subsidizing or offsetting executive salaries and benefits of individuals who are not employees of the SEA or LEAs or 2) expenditures related to state or local teacher or faculty unions or associations.

How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

CCSD conducted a parent survey to determined divides at home as well as reliable internet. We are a 1:1 district; however, we need to use some funds to replace los/stolen/broken chromebooks. Our survey also determined that student, staff, and visitor safety be a priority. The nacessary PPE, and sanitizing products and training will need to be purchased. The cost of substitutes will need to be included for staff absence due to COVID, so that in class students can continue to receive guidance and help academically. Due to the current state of cases in Chambers County and the fact that we do NOT have one nurse per school, it has been determined we need to hire 2 additional nurses. Investment in online learning tools and remote learning packets are considered high priority as well. In order to be prepared for students to active safe to school it has been determined additional contract days need to be offered for employees to return early for special need plans, medical plans, CNP plans, transportation, and remediation plans. Because of the financial impact on the citizens of Chambers County, (lost wages, lost jobs, etc.) the district plans to use some funds to help purchase actool supplies for all students, CCSD has also determined additional hourty pay to a limited number of teachers who will provide assistance to our remote learning technase for exclool at least two days a week for no more than three hours a day. Teachers will be scheduled to work after thier normal contract hours in order to provide additional help to students.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

CCSD uses a variety of screening tools (STAR, Edgenuity, Global Scholar, etc.) to identify gaps in the critical standards identified by the SDE. These assessments will be given as soon as students return to school. Data will be used to identify individual as well as group learning gaps for remedilation. Currently, IEP's, 504's and medical plans are being reviewed to determine needed changes for those students opting for online *I* remote learning. CCSD has also determined the need for technology director and network technician software training to assist teachers/students with various new software programs implemented to assist remote learners and tutoring efforts. Our system offers two hours of after school tutoring twice a week to all students, and provide transportation services to students who are in need of receiving additional academic assistance.

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What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

CCSD began identifying students who struggled to participate in virtual learning. Summer services have been offered virtually to help close gaps. Substitutes will be necessary when certain positions are absent due to COVID. Professional Development is being designed and implemented for sanitation, serving food, transporting students, online learning tools, and assessments. All activities are planned for a period through September 30, 2022.

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

We will purchase additional devices to keep us as a 1:1 district and we will be using funds to purchase ads/notices to keep our students/parents/public notified in order for all students to have equitable opportunities to participate in regards to remote learning. Remote packets will be available for those who choose or need paper. We will also provide additional pay to certified staff to assist remote learners based on grade level.

3. Equitable Services Assurances

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies the following:

- The LEA receiving ESSER funds will provide equitable services to students and teachers in non-public schools as required under Section 18005 of Division B of the CARES Act.

Equitable services are provided based on the qualified enrollment at the private school. Consultation will occur through planning sessions over the summer of 2020. The timeline for services begin in the summer of 2020 through September 2022.

(5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;

(6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;

(7) that in the case of any project involving construction -

(A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;

(8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and

(9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
(c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

What steps does the LEA propose to take to permit students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries to overcome barriers (including barriers based on gender, race, color, national origin, disability, and age) that impede equal access to, or participation in, the program?

These proposed expenditures are for all students throughout the district. Providing school supplies, devices, remote learning packets will be provided to allow participation by all students. In addition to providing students with the option of in class learning, CCSD will use funds to cover the cost of substitutes when certain employees are absent due to COVID. CCSD will continually evaluate access to learning and identification of barriers that impede access to learning and participation in the learing program. We will act accordingly as barriers are identified.
