## PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

## How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

Birmingham City Schools will determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19 by completing teacher surveys, parent surveys, and departmental needs assessments. A CARES committee and an Opening of Schools committee will be formed to collect the data. Information from these data sources will be analyzed and the best determination will be made based upon the data results. Birmingham City Schools will work with all stakeholders to ensure the educational needs of students are being addressed.

# How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

It is the goal of Birmingham City Schools (BCS) to ensure that every student receives a quality education. BCS will provide opportunities for students to receive extended learning by providing summer enrichment and academic lutoring during BCS Intersession periods. This intersession period is a period of time where students will receive tutoring outside of a regular school day. Students will be exposed to evidenced-based instructional strategies designed to increase student achievement. In addition, students will be screened and progressed monitored throughout the FY21 academic school year to address the learning gaps which may have occurred during the time of COVID-19. Additionally, professional development will be provided to teachers to ensure that student learning needs are being addressed in an effort to close the gap.

## What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

Birmingham City Schools' timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff.

## How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

Birmingham City Schools will support remote learning by providing students with technology devices to use at home to ensure they are able to participate in the virtual experience. All students in grades K-12 will receive a technology device. Teachers will also be provided devices to ensure they are able to provide remote learning to students.

#### 3. Equitable Services Assurances

Birmingham City Schools intent is to ensure that all private schools who want to participate are provided the opportunity. Intent letters were mailed to surrounding private schools for their intent to participate. Those private schools who elect to participate will participate in consultation with the district. Each private school will be assigned a district support person to collaborate with them in completion of their equitable services plan and assist with the understanding of allowable purchases. Private schools equitable services funds will be used to support the same areas as it appear in part 3 of the equitable services plans. After reviewing the equitable services plans from BCS participating private schools, many will utilize funds for sanitation, cleaning supplies, equipment, computer hardware, staff training, health contractors, tutoring, personal protective equipment, instructional software, instructional materials and supplies, audio/visual equipment, magazines/periodicals, professional development, license fees, and software maintenance agreement.

## 4. Other Assurances and Certifications

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies the following:

- The LEA that receives ESSER funds will, to the greatest extent practicable, continue to compensate its employees and contractors during the period of any disruptions or closures related to COVID-19 in compliance with Section 18006 of Division B of the CARES Act. In addition, LEAs that accept funds will continue to pay employees and contractors to the greatest extent practicable based on the unique financial circumstances of the LEA. CARES Act funds generally will not be used for bonuses, merit pay, or similar expenditures, unless related to disruptions or closures resulting from COVID-19.

- (5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program:
- (6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;
  - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
    - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and
- (9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
- (c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

#### 6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

- (a) The purpose of this section is to assist the Department in implementing the Department's mission to ensure equal access to education and to promote educational excellence throughout the Nation, by -
- (1) ensuring equal opportunities to participate for all eligible students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries in any project or activity carried out under an applicable program; and
  - (2) promoting the ability of such students, teachers, and beneficiaries to meet high standards.

- (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter in any way the rights or responsibilities established under the laws cited in section 400(d) of this Act.
