PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

2. Allowable Service(s) Assurance

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies that:

The LEA will use ESSER funds for activities allowable under section 18003(d) of Division B of the CARES Act. How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

1)Safety will be the priority. Needs will be evaluated and materials/equipment will be ordered and stocked. Materials will include PPE supplies and hand sanitizer. Facilities will have maintenance repairs to become safer which include adjustments to the water fountains, provide adequate hand washing stations, and the nurse station modifications.

2)The LEA intends to review available testing from 2019-2020 school year compared to early testing in fall of 2020 in order to identify learning gaps.

3)The LEA will be conscience of any emotional needs of the students and seek available help/resources for those experiencing undo trauma.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

- 1)The LEA intends to review available testing data from previous year compared to early testing in the fall of 2020 to identify any instructional gaps.
- 2)The LEA will hire on-line facilitator who will guide students face to face as well as on-line in programs to eliminate or reduce gaps in instruction.
- 3)The LEA will inventory equipment and purchase necessary devices to enable one to one ability for students in grades 3-12.
- 4)The LEA will analyze data from surveys of households for Internet availability and assist with providing low cost/no cost options.
- 5)The LEA will provide tutoring, intervention, and instructional programs to close gaps caused by the COVID-19 disruption.
- 6)The LEA will purchase audio-visual equipment for a social distancing assembly area to be used by students during the school day and during literacy camp.
- 7)The LEA will utilize purchased audio-visual equipment for teacher professional development in an assembly area conducive to social distancing requirements.

September 2020- September 2022 - Implement programs to address safety and instructional gaps. All services will conclude 9/30/2022

- 2) The LEA will survey households for Internet availability and help provide low cost/no cost options.
- 3) The LEA will make learning packets available to pre-k through grade 2 if needed.

- (6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;
 - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
 - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and
 - (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and
- (9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
- (c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

- (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter in any way the rights or responsibilities established under the laws cited in section 400(d) of this Act.
