This correspondence is to inform you of the Career and Technical Education (CTE) career coach allocations for FY 2023 in the amount of \$93,191.00. This allocation includes salaries and benefits in the amount of \$70,358.00, Other Current Expense (OCE) in the amount of \$21,175.00, and classroom instructional supply funds in the amount of \$1,658.00. This allocation funds the salary and benefits and all classroom instructional support funds for one or multiple career coaches.

District IV Vice President An updated copy of a sample Career Coach Job Description and a list of local education agencies (LEA) receiving a new career coach allocation during FY 2023 are attached. These allocations are 100 percent state funds and should be budgeted and expended using Revenue and Fund Source 1281 and Object Code 112. LEAs who earned one or more career coach allocations prior to FY 2023 will find the funds listed as an additional CTE director in the <a href="FY2023 LEA Unit Breakdown Report">FY2023 LEA Unit Breakdown Report</a>. The additional FY 2023 CTE funds will be sent monthly with the state funds electronic transfer beginning October 2022 through September 2023. Any unused funds not expended by September 30, 2023, will revert back to the Alabama State Department of Education.

## **QUALIFICATIONS**

**Required:** Bachelor's degree in education, marketing, communication, or related field. In addition, the career coach must have the ability to pass a background check.

#### **DUTIES**

- Represent the Career Coach Program in local schools and conduct public relations efforts to promote CTE programs.
- Possess a working knowledge of the Alabama Career Development Model and assist with its implementation.
- Provide career development guidance for middle and high school students with emphasis on technical programs.
- Plan and implement student recruitment activities for technical programs.
- Possess a working knowledge of the Alabama Career Planning System and assist with its implementation in elementary, middle, and high schools.
- Assist elementary and secondary students with career exploration activities and career assessments.
- Assist students with college admissions, financial aid—including FAFSA—and registration procedures.
- Provide information to educators, students, and their families regarding the current job market and career choices.
- Conduct classroom presentations promoting college and career programs and activities.
- Schedule and attend college campus tours and industry tours with students.
- Assist with coordinating job shadowing and other work-based learning opportunities for students.
- Maintain ongoing database of career coach services available and submit reports of completed activities.
