Secretary and Executive Officer The Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) is committed to supporting you during this first year of implementation of the *Alabama Numeracy Act*. <u>Act 2022-249</u>¹ was enacted to implement steps to improve mathematics proficiency of public school K-5 grade students and to ensure that those students are mathematically proficient at or above grade level by the end of fifth grade.

As previously mentioned in Midweek Matters, the new ALSDE's Office of Mathematics Improvement has been established—with Dr. Karen Anderson directing this work. The Early Mathematics Task Force (EMTF) has met three times thus far, and their early work is underway. Much like the *Alabama Literacy Act*, the *Alabama Numeracy Act* provides for the identification of Full-Support and Limited-Support Schools; the use of recommended early assessments, intervention programs and core programs; required summer achievement programs for students identified with a mathematics deficiency; and many other strategies to improve student mathematics proficiency. You will be notified of EMTF recommendations for assessments, core programs, etc., as soon as they are available.

We are excited about the opportunities to have building-based math coaches and other various components of the Act, and the ALSDE will provide ongoing updates to assist in implementation. Following is a general implementation timeline regarding items from the Act that directly pertain to local education agencies (LEAs).
