## PUBLIC HEARING TO DISCUSS RESOLUTION TO APPROVE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE STATE TEXTBOOK COMMITTEE FOR ADOPTION OF TEXTBOOKS FOR ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS, GRADES K-3

## RESOLUTION IN RECOGNITION OF MARCH 6-10, 2023, AS "NATIONAL SCHOOL BREAKFAST WEEK" IN ALABAMA SCHOOLS

WHEREAS, the Alabama State Board of Education and the Alabama State Department of Education has recognized since 1975, the National School Breakfast Program has contributed to the health and educational development of Alabama's children by making nutritious meals available in Grades K-12 public schools; and

**WHEREAS**, every March, the School Nutrition Association and the U.S. Department of Agriculture join together to celebrate the National School Breakfast Week; and

**WHEREAS** the National School Breakfast Week 2023 (#NSBW23) theme is "Dig into School Breakfast," which spotlights the wide variety of flavors, dishes, delivery options, and tastes that can be customized in today's school breakfast; and

**WHEREAS** research has indicated that students who eat breakfast have better attention and memory, and the quality of foods children eat impacts cognition, and poor nutrition is linked with absenteeism, health problems, hunger symptoms, and psychosocial problems; and

**WHEREAS** scientifically based food and nutrition information contributes powerful education benefits to all elementary and secondary students; and

**WHEREAS** the Alabama School Breakfast Program served over 49,024,641 million breakfast meals for the school year 2021-2022 to Alabama students:

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** That the Alabama State Board of Education does hereby express its appreciation to the Alabama school nutrition professionals who make the local School Breakfast Program work in 1,455 school sites statewide; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** That the Alabama State Board of Education encourages Alabama schools to participate in promoting National School Breakfast Week; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** That the Alabama State Board of Education designate March 6-10, 2023, as "National School Breakfast Week" in the public schools of Alabama.

## RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING MARCH 12-18, 2023, AS CHILD AND ADULT CARE FOOD PROGRAM WEEK IN ALABAMA

**WHEREAS**, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) administered in Alabama by the Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE), Child Nutrition Section, reaffirms the vital role positive nutritional habits play in the healthy growth of children; and

WHEREAS ALSDE recognizes the importance of nutritional education for the most vulnerable and youngest children, as well as adults, through CACFP care centers and homes across the state of Alabama; and

**WHEREAS** the CACFP provides daily meals and snacks to children and adults which increases the quality of care; and

**WHEREAS,** in 2022, Alabama served 27.5 million meals through the CACFP to children and adults at 495 child and adult care centers; and

**WHEREAS** the innovative approach to CACFP implementation, which pairs childcare homes and centers, adult day care centers, and after-school sites with ALSDE highlights a unique public-private partnership that supports working families and small businesses; and

**WHEREAS** the third week of March is annually recognized as "National CACFP Week" to raise awareness of the child and adult care food program and the nutritional benefits established by the USDA:

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** That the Alabama State Board of Education does designate March 12-18, 2023, as "National CACFP Week" in Alabama.
