- 3. The school district/public agency must provide a copy of the Special Education Rights if this is the first written state complaint filed by the parent in a school year.
- 4. All information requested that is identified with a "*" is required information for a State Complaint to be considered complete. A complaint that is received without the required content may be dismissed or returned, which could delay resolution of the issues.
