**RE:** Proposal for the Dependent Care Development Grant

Attached is a proposal packet for the Dependent Care Development Grant. Funding comes from the Alabama Department of Human Resources (DHR) through an interagency agreement to start, expand, or improve the quality of programs for school-age, extended-day/-year childcare services for communities needing this service. This includes before/after school and summer childcare for programs that include students from kindergarten to age 13.

Contingent upon the Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) receiving a signed agreement from DHR, approximately 16 grant awards in the amount of \$20,219.25 each will be awarded for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 and FY 2025 beginning October 1, 2023, and ending September 30, 2025. It is a two-year grant.

If a local education agency (LEA) is interested in applying for these funds, please complete and return the attached proposal packet in the format requested by Thursday, August 24, 2023. We encourage you to duplicate this proposal for schools serving children from kindergarten to age 13. Systems may submit multiple proposals but only one submission per school. The extended-day/-year program must operate in a school or school system building. Schools presently served by 21st Century Community Learning Center grants administered by the ALSDE are not eligible to apply. The proposal must be in the Federal Programs Section by August 24, 2023. Faxed submissions are not permissible.

<u>PROGRAM DESCRIPTION</u>: The Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) will award funds to plan, develop, expand, or improve extended-day/-year childcare services. Approximately sixteen grant awards in the amount of \$20, 219.25, on a competitive proposal basis, will distribute to local education agencies (LEAs) for Fiscal Years 2024 and 2025. The proposals must be in the established format and be at most eight (8) double-spaced, typewritten pages. Applications must be at most eight pages to receive a read and score. The Dependent Care Development Grant funds cannot be used for equipment purchases, indirect costs, out-of-state travel, or food items. Proposals (one original and three copies) must be in the Federal Programs Section by July 10, 2023. Fax applications are not permissible.

**ASSURANCES:** The LEA superintendent must sign the Statement of Assurances. Each proposal must

have the signed assurances with the cover sheet.
