Thank you for your continued efforts in embracing the Science of Reading (SoR) by fully implementing the 2021 Alabama Course of Study: English Language Arts that aligns with the <u>Alabama Literacy Act</u> 2019-523 (ALA). Through ongoing collaboration with local education agencies (LEAs), the Alabama Reading Initiative (ARI) recognizes the importance of providing key ALA implementation due dates and professional development opportunities to assist with 2023-2024 planning.
