**Montgomery, Ala.** – Earlier this month, Child Nutrition Programs (CNP) school nutrition professionals along with Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) CNP educators participated in the Governor's Proclamation Signing hour at the state capitol in Montgomery.



The State of Alabama officially recognized the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), serving nearly 30 million children each day, with Governor Ivey signing a Proclamation.

This week, Alabama schools have been celebrating National School Lunch Week (NSLW), from October 9-13, 2023. The event's fun and creative campaign theme,

"Level Up with School Lunch," highlights the importance of healthy school lunches to students' success, both in and out of the classroom. Research shows children are getting their healthiest meals at school.

NSLW highlights the nutritious foods available daily in Alabama schools. Students who have lunch are better able to learn and retain information and often have less absenteeism, health problems, hunger symptoms, and psychosocial problems.
