- **RE:** State At-Risk Funds Allocated for Fiscal Year (FY) 2021

The FY 2021 State At-Risk funds have been allocated to the Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) and will be distributed to local education agencies (LEAs) for at-risk programs, alternative education programs, school safety enhancement programs, and programs to prevent students from dropping out of school.

The LEA may receive FY 2021 funds by submitting plan components and budget pages as found in the attached State At-Risk Plan document and by completing an evaluation of FY 2020 programs. At-risk program funds will not be disbursed until the LEA has a complete FY 2021 State At-Risk Plan on file at the ALSDE.
