Overview of Paid Lunch Equity (PLE)

Why is this important to Child Nutrition Programs?

SFAs participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) must ensure that sufficient funds are provided to the non-profit school food service account for meals served to students not eligible for free or reducedprice meals. This requirement may be met through the prices charged for "paid" meals or through non-Federal sources provided to the non-profit school food service account.



SFAs must complete the Paid Lunch Equity (PLE) Tool for all meals served in the Child Nutrition Program.

USDA's PLE Provision ensures that:

- Schools are not charging less for school meals than it costs to produce the meal.
- Federal funds intended for free and reducedprice lunches are not subsidizing paid student meals.
- Schools have funding available to support serving nutritious meals to all students.



Section 205 of the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 requires School Food Authorities (SFAs) participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) to provide the same level of financial support for lunches served to students who are not eligible for free or reduced-price lunches (i.e., paid lunches) as for lunches served to students eligible for free lunches.

PLE Requirements for SFA's

Who is not required to complete the Annual PLE Tool?

All SFAs, regardless of current lunch prices, must annually review their paid lunch prices to ensure compliance with the paid lunch equity requirement using the current year USDA Paid Lunch Equity (PLE) Tool. However, some SFAs are <u>NOT Required</u> to complete the Annual PLE Tool.

EXCEPTIONS

SFAs operating the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) district wide (100% of the schools) and non-pricing programs for lunch (i.e., Provision 2, RCCIs without day students, etc.) do not have to complete the PLE Tool.

Exception

to, the

SFAs operating CEP and other non-pricing programs for only some schools must still complete the PLE Tool. The tool will be completed using only the paid lunch prices and meals served in schools that are pricing.

PLE Requirements for SFA's

What are the annual requirements for USDA?

The PLE Tool must be completed annually by SFAs that are charging for student meals to determine if they are required to raise lunch prices unless there is an exemption.

Whether you are required to or choose to complete the PLE Tool, please maintain it for record retention. Best practice is to keep the completed PLE Tool on file for at least five to seven (5-7) years. If you are a pricing district, you will be asked to produce this information during an Administrative Review (AR). Important Information for SY 2024-2025:

- Any SFA with a positive or zero balance in its nonprofit school food service account as of June 30, 2023, is exempt from the PLE pricing requirements found at 7 CFR 210.14(e) for school year (SY) 2024-25. SFAs will be required to opt-in for the exemption, as well as provide proof of a positive balance in their NSFSA.
- SFAs that had a negative balance in the nonprofit school food service account as of June 30, 2023, must follow PLE requirements according to 7 CFR 210.14(e) when establishing their paid lunch prices for SY 24-25.

PLE Requirements for SFA's

Submitting the PLE Exemption Form for SY 2023-2024

PLE Exemption Form SY2025 and Attestation of Positive Operating Balance 6/30/2023

Submit Exemption Form by 5/31/24

For SY 2024-2025, SFAs with a positive or zero balance in the nonprofit school food service account as of June 30, 2023, are exempt from PLE pricing requirements found at 7 CFR 210.14(e). Please complete and submit this form if the SFA does not plan to raise school meal prices for SY2025.

If you choose to apply for a PLE Exemption for SY 2024-2025, please note that the ALSDE will not send out separate approval letters to SFAs. The completed Microsoft Form will serve as the SFA's approval documentation.

Eligible SFAs must complete the "Paid Lunch Equity (PLE) Exemption Form" to opt-in for the PLE exemption for SY 2023-2024. This form was due on May 31, 2024. This was done through Microsoft Forms.

- SFAs Should retain a copy of the documentation of file.
- If the balance sheet has a negative balance as of June 30, 2023, the SFA does not qualify for an exemption and must follow PLE Pricing Requirements for SY 2024-2025.

The annual PLE requirement or target price is based on the difference between the reimbursement rate for free meals and the reimbursement rate for paid meals for the previous school year. The information from the lowest reimbursement category (less than 60%) is utilized.

Example:

*Reimbursement for free meal (SY23-24) \$4.25 Reimbursement for paid meal (SY23-24) -\$ 0.40

SY23-24 Weighted Average Price \$3.85

*The paid price requirement changes annually dependent on the reimbursement rates for school meals set by the federal government each year.

USDA Yearly Target Price

How the Weighted Average Price Requirement is Calculated

Example:

*Reimbursement for free meal (SY23-24) \$4.25 Reimbursement for paid meal (SY23-24) -\$ 0.40

SY23-24 Weighted Average Price \$3.85

When the average paid lunch price is less than the weighted average price (target price), the SFA must take action by:

- Increasing the prices charged for paid lunch meals (max of \$0.10), or;
- Providing non-Federal funding sources to the non-profit school food service account.
- Increasing prices and contributing nonfederal funds.

Non-Federal sources may include:

- Per-meal, non-federal reimbursement for any paid meal
- Any funds provided by organizations for any paid meal (Community Groups, PTO/PTA, etc.)
- Any proportion attributable to paid meals from direct payments made from school district funds to support lunch service (unpaid meal charges account)

Paid Lunch Equity Tool for School Year 2024-2025 Instructions

The Paid Lunch Equity (PLE) Tool was created to help School Food Authorities (SFAs) calculate their new weighted average price requirement for the school year (SY) and determine what price increase is needed to meet the requirement. There are three methods for how SFAs can meet the requirement and the tool assists with making calculations based on the method chosen. This version of the PLE Tool only applies to SY 2024-2025 as a new version of the PLE Tool will b issued for SY 2025-26.

The SY 2024-25 PLE Tool consists of 8 tabs:

Tab 1: Guidance

Tab 2: Instructions

Tab 3: SY 24-25 Requirement Calculator

Tab 4: SY 24-25 Price Raise Calculator

Tab 5: SY 24-25 Non-Federal Calculator

Tab 6: SY 24-25 Split Calculator

Tab 7: SY 24-25 Report

Tab 8: SY 10-11 Price Calculator

SFAs will follow the specific instructions pertaining to the method they choose to meet the requirement and only use the calculator (tab) that corresponds to that method.

Reminders:

• The PLE Tool calculates the weighted average of all student paid lunch prices charged in the SFA.


 The maximum annual average price increase required will not exceed 10 cents. This may lead to some shortfall being carried over to the next school year as some SFAs will not be required to raise their weighted average price or contribute revenue from non-Federal sources to the nonprofit food service account due to this 10 cents cap.

Depending on where the SFA is relative to the Weighted Average Price Requirement for SY 2024-25, a contribution less than 10 cents may be required.

Completing the PLE Tool

Steps and Information Needed to Complete the PLE Tool





Data Needed

To complete the PLE Tool, SFAs will need to gather the following information:

- Current school year unrounded price requirement
- All paid student lunch prices for October of current school year for all schools
- Number of paid student lunches served associated with each paid student lunch price in October of current school year for all schools



SFAs may use the prices they last charged students as the basis for their SY 2024-2025 paid lunch price calculation, even if those prices were charged during a year the SFA was not required to comply with PLE requirements. For example, SFAs that received flexibility under the PLE waiver during SY 2023-2024 may use prices charged during SY 2023-2024 to determine their PLE requirement for SY 2024-2025.

SmartTips for PLE

- The best way to find information on the number of paid meal prices for October 2023 the SFA will review its site data claim for Program Year 2024, October 2023. The SFA will retrieve information for PAID meal LUNCH prices only.
- You can retrieve paid lunch meal pricing information from the Online Agreement. You would go to the Policy Checklist and go to Program Year 2024.
- SFAs do not have to complete a PLE Tool for each school. In the PLE Tool, the SFA will enter the combined paid meal prices for each paid lunch meal price for October 2023. The PLE Tool will automatically average these prices to calculate the average weighted meal price.

Using the Non-Federal Contribution Calculator – Lunch Prices Are Not Increased
