This cluster prepares students for employment in career pathways that relate to families and human needs, such as family and community services, personal care, and consumer services. There are six program areas: Consumer Services; Early Childhood Development Services; Family Studies and Community Services; Fashion; Food, Wellness, and Dietetics; and Interior Design/Real Estate. Rigorous instruction is provided to equip students with knowledge and skills needed in preparation for credentials, articulation, and/or further education.

Students in Grades 9-12 may choose to pursue studies in any one of the following programs: Clothing, Textiles, and Interior Design; Consumer Services; Family Studies and Community Services; and Nutrition and Wellness after successfully completing the required foundation course, Family and Consumer Sciences.
