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## Hospitality and Tourism Cluster Program Guide

This cluster prepares learners for careers in the hospitality industry. Students develop skills in organization, teamwork, problem solving, creativity, time management, customer service, and communication. Applications of technology, math, and science are also important components of the courses. Rigorous and engaging instruction fosters the essential skills needed for future employment and equips learners with knowledge and skills they will need for college and careers. This diversified and intensive education program enables students to pursue careers in one of four pathways: Food, and Beverage Services; Lodging; Travel, and Tourism; and Sports, Recreation, and Attractions.

Within this pathway, students can pursue a national sanitation certification, industry certification, articulation credit, and scholarships. The courses offered involve a commercial laboratory-based instructional setting and internship hours.

Guest Service skills focus on communication, leadership, time management, teamwork, problem solving, critical thinking, and professionalism. This program includes internship in which students gain hands-on experience in a lodging property. Within this pathway, students can pursue a national industry certification.
